A MESSAGE FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Dear Friends of Xavier Mission,

This past year was one of transition. We saw the departure of the Pastor and President of Xavier Mission, Fr. Joe Marina, and Associate Pastor, Fr. Peter Fink. We also said goodbye to our longtime employee Alexandra Hoffman as she departed to pursue

a Masters degree in Social Work. We then said hello to our new President, Fr. Bob VerEecke, as well as our new Director of Outreach, Christina Bowman, and welcomed them both into the Xavier family.

Despite the upheaval, Xavier Mission achieved some wonderful things in 2015-2016! We secured funding to completely renovate our shelter space. Improvements included new flooring, ceiling tiles, lighting, kitchen cabinets, and a brand new computer space for guests. The space was dedicated to and named after Rev. Ned Coughlin, SJ, a staunch supporter of our shelter and social justice.

We also revised the Xavier Mission by-laws to create a formal Board of Directors. We now have a Board of Members that holds high-level powers and oversees the new Board of Directors, which is a traditional operational Board that works with the Executive Director to ensure the smooth operation of Xavier Mission. This amazing team has been working non-stop since they first came together and have accomplished a year's worth of work in six months! With the incredible effort by the Board to fundraise, and the exceptional generosity of Fr. VerEecke in forgiving a large debt owed to the church, Xavier Mission is in a much more stable financial situation.

As we face the uncertainty of the current political climate, Xavier Mission is actively preparing contingency plans that will allow us to meet an increased demand for services without sacrificing the depth and effectiveness of our current programs. We are engaging in a thorough assessment of

our operations, to make sure that we are running as efficient an organization as possible, which will allow us to better plan for the future.

While the last year has been filled with ups and downs, rest assured that the work of Xavier Mission never falters. Through thick and thin we continue serving those who come to us for their basic needs, for community, and for support, meeting them with open, welcoming arms and ensuring that their needs are met in a safe, loving and dignified environment. Thank you for being a part of this effort, and for making it possible for Xavier Mission to be a place of rest and refuge for those who are suffering.

It's been almost nine years since I first walked downstairs to the Welcome Table of Xavier Mission. I was blown away. I had done volunteer work for many other organizations, but hearing the stories of the guests at Xavier Mission and learning about their circumstances really touched me. The Mission was caring for these amazing people on so many different levels, from serving them a hot meal, to offering legal advice, to nursing assistance, or a fast adjustment from the volunteer Chiropractor! The Mission makes it possible for our quests



to step inside and have their world changed for an hour or two to where they are safe, cared for, and respected. I have missed very few Sundays at the Welcome Table; I plan my travel schedule around it. Giving my time and money to the Mission has been one of the most fulfilling investments I have ever made. I have had many of my family members, friends, and business colleagues ask me how they could invest as well, because they can see my enthusiasm for it. I have learned many things from my work at Xavier Mission, but I believe that one of the most important is to "never look down on somebody unless you are helping them up."

It is truly my pleasure to be a part of Xavier Mission. I accidentally stumbled upon it while there one Sunday for a NYCares initiation program. I had no idea I would feel so moved by the guests. I, like most, had walked by people on the street and ignored their cries for help or for food out of fear of them. Yet when I actually came face to face with one of the guests, instead of being afraid, I saw the sweetest, kindest eyes. That was when I knew I belonged here. I started coming every week and I love it. In so many ways the guests have

helped me more than I'm helping them. I was at a very sad, lonely place in life when I happened upon the Welcome Table. So when I looked into that man's eyes, for me it was like God saying to me "You belong here Nicole". I'm much happier these days because I'm not stuck in my own head anymore; I'm a lot more aware and grateful. I'm also thrilled to share my god given talents by styling the hair and outfits of the L-STEP participants for their graduation. It's wonderful to be a part of such a great evening. There is something special about the Mission and I look forward to focusing my volunteer efforts here in the future.

XAVIER MISSION COMMUNITY STORIES

DAMARIS SIERRA, L-STEP GRADUATE

I was living at an alcohol and substance abuse residential program called Greenhope Services for Women. While at the facility I learned how to live sober and I realized that I wanted to achieve greater things in my life. The vocational counselor at the facility recommended L-STEP and said it would be perfect for me. Initially I thought that L-STEP was a place where they assist with housing and educate people about homelessness, but it turned out to be more than that. It was a place that felt like home, a place where we shared our deepest feelings, a place where we felt like family but most of all it was the place where I discovered my purpose.



L-STEP presented a workshop about colleges and careers. As we all were looking down the list of careers, I remember feeling this rush of hope and excitement and I burst out in front of everyone that I was interested in becoming a substance abuse counselor. The facilitators were so supportive, told me that I would be perfect for that profession, and said that if they could do anything to help me achieve my goal they would do it. I left that session and felt hope, that I had a dream and that I could achieve it. I worked hard for the three years following my graduation from L-STEP. I went to school and obtained my CASAC-T. I now work at an outpatient program as an intake specialist/counselor. I wake up every day feeling blessed and thankful for each and every opportunity that I have ever received. If it weren't for programs like L-STEP I wouldn't be where I am today.




